



# Craft Project Rose

## Supplies

M127 - Rainbow Matt Squares

Scissors - Glue

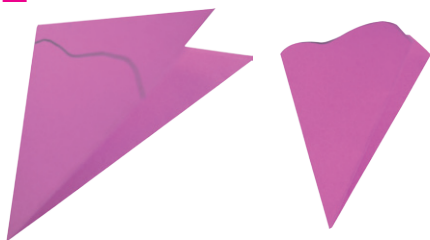


### Step 1.



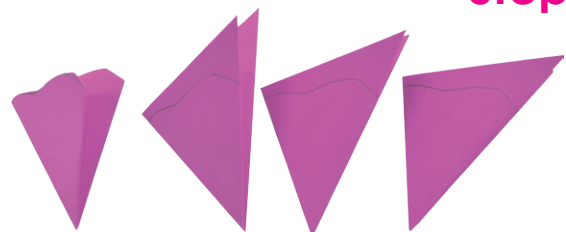
Grab four sheets of the 125mm Matt Square paper. You can use any colour you like, we have gone with a traditional pink in this example. Fold the paper from bottom point to top point to create a triangle shape. Fold the paper like this on itself three times (as shown in the image on the left).

### Step 2



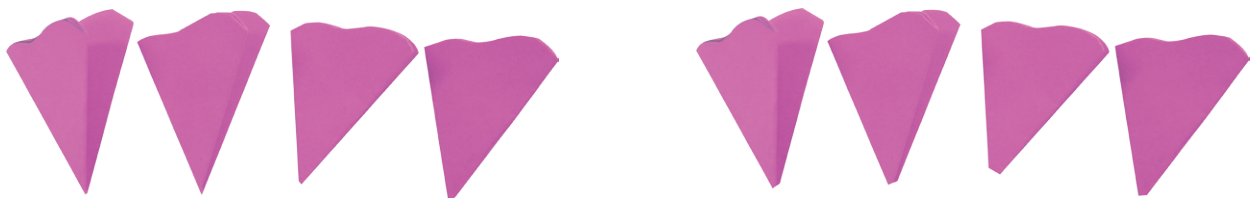
Mark a two bump pattern across the open flap to the fixed edge of one of your folded sheets and cut along the guide.

### Step 3



Use your first cut sheet as a template and mark the other sheets and cut. It's ok for each to be slightly different as that will give the finished rose a more organic natural look.

### Step 4.



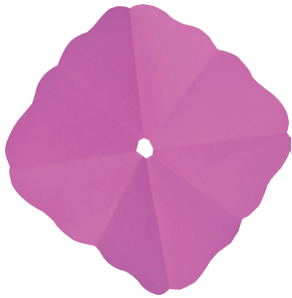
After you have cut your bump pattern of the top of each folded sheet. Cut the bottom point of each folded sheet, it should look similar to a piping bag to this stage.

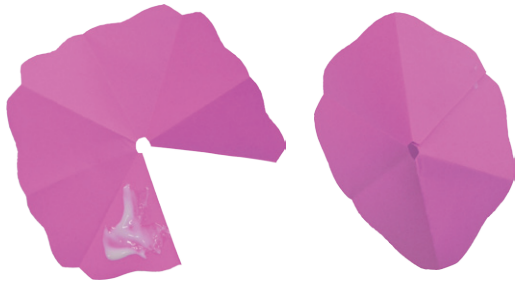

### Step 5.



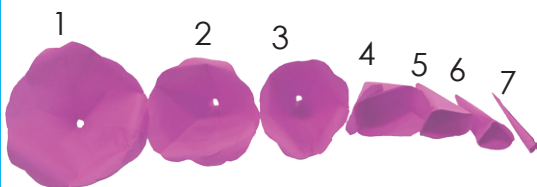
Unfold each of your four sheets. They should look similar to the above image.

### Step 7.

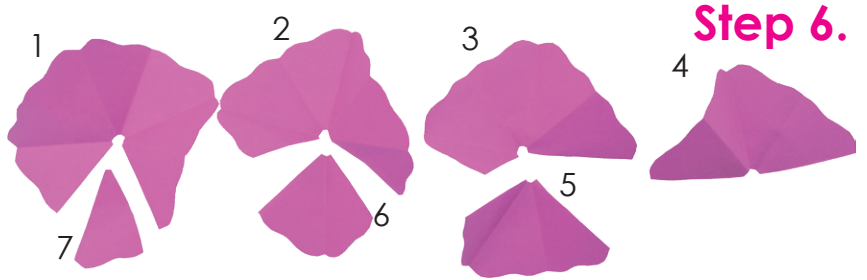


Glue the last left section of 1 and paste onto the last right section.

### Step 9.

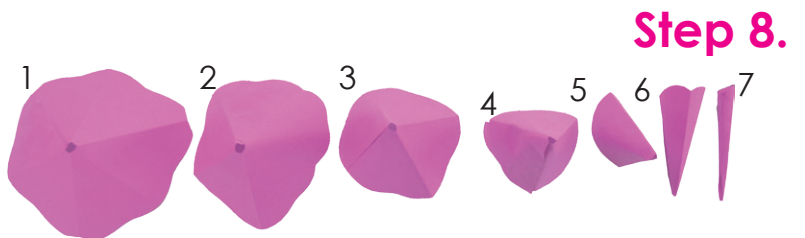


Roll out/down the edges of each glued section.



### Step 6.

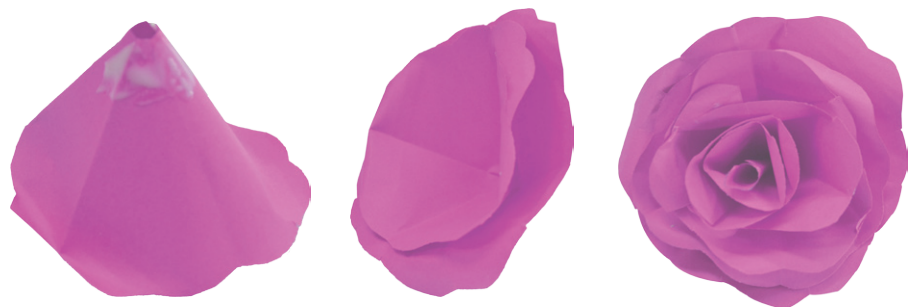
Use your fold marks as guides and cut a section out of your first unfolded sheet. Do the same for each sheet, however add a section each time. So sheet 1 cut one section, sheet 2 cut two sections, sheet 3 three sections and sheet 4 four sections. Keep all cuts except for one half of the last sheet. You should be left with 7 sections. We will refer to them as 1 through to 7 going from largest to smallest.



### Step 8.

Follow the same process for all the other sections except for the last two. You will need to roll them up on themselves and glue down.

### Step 10.



Glue the tip of section 2 and insert into section 1. Do the same for each section and glue into number section above. So 2 into 1, 3 into 2, 4 into 3 etc etc. Once finished allow to dry.
